Rector's Message

Rector's Report

2009 was my first full year as Rector of Christ Church. It has truly been the best year of my life, both personally and professionally. I continue to feel deeply grateful, privileged, and excited to live and work here, and I am looking forward to many more wonderful years together engaging in God's mission.

From the very end of 2008 through 2009, we have welcomed several new people from 6 households to the church, and we have seen some growth in the number of pledging units between the 2009 and 2010 appeals. In 2009, the average Sunday attendance was 56, which is up from 45 in 2008. We give thanks for 3 baptisms in 2009: Lucia Jacquez, Alex Walker, and Kaelin Hamilton; and we give thanks for the lives of those who died during the year: Beverly Barrett Childs, Michael Grant, and Betty Jaynes.

The Vestry was hard at work this year. A lot of time and energy went into the preconstruction phase of the much needed repairs and renovations to the church building. There are many items that must be in place before actual work on buildings can begin to ensure that the project runs as smoothly as possible – meaning that work follows standard/expected business procedures, gets done in a timely manner, stays on budget, and is correct. This preconstruction phase is very detailed and time consuming but is extremely helpful in the long run. The Vestry has been diligent and thorough in this work, and we look forward to the completion of the repairs and renovations in 2010. The repairs and renovations, which have been mentioned a lot during the year (and are detailed in the Junior Warden's Report), address the safety, accessibility, and usability of the building and will open more possibilities for the ministry through our church.



All of the repairs and renovations are being paid for by funds in our endowment, specifically the money Bill Johnson and Wes Talkington left to the church. We are fortunate to have this funding, but as we move forward, we need to develop a building fund to address ongoing maintenance and upkeep and to generate funding for the parish to work with in the future. It is vital for current members to be proactive and invest in the building as well.

The church is not really the building but the people and the work of the people. During a major building project like ours, it is a challenge to stay focused on the people and the work of the people. But the Vestry, while working on the building project, has done an excellent job in keeping our focus where it should ultimately be. The Vestry is forward-looking and focusing on our ministry. In 2009, we also accepted some rare opportunities for the coming year: hosting and participating in a Magnetic Church Conference, which will help us attract and retain new members, and hosting a part of the Presiding Bishop's visitation to the Diocese of West Virginia.

We thank those who are continuing their service on the Vestry in 2010: Toni Balenger (Treasurer), Neal Hamilton, Gary Metheny (Junior Warden), Laura Withers-Boyles, and Carla Wood. Four members are going off of the Vestry at this time: Kent Brown, Kyle Hamilton, Sally Tennant, and Jeff Wallace. Each one brought exceptional gifts to the church through their Vestry positions, and I invite you to join me in thanking them for their service. All four served as officers during their terms. Sally served as Treasurer. Both Kent and Jeff served as Junior Wardens. And Kyle served as Senior Warden. Kyle not only served as Senior Warden, but he did so for three consecutive years *and* during a transition in clergy. This was no ordinary task. Kyle's work and commitment to the church has been outstanding, and I am deeply grateful to have had the opportunity to work with him, especially in my first year as a rector.

Additionally, several parishioners who served in other leadership roles are finishing their terms as well. Rick Heim is completing his term as a Trustee. Louise Lawson, Chris Metheny, and Jude Miller (Chair) have all completed terms on the Outreach Committee. We thank each of them for their commitment and good work. Details of their work are provided in other sections of the Annual Report packet.

In April, we welcomed a new staff member. Melinda Parker joined us as church Secretary. Her work has been exemplary. She not only keeps the office (and me!) in excellent order, but her work has been instrumental in positioning Christ Church for growth. We are fortunate to have Melinda and all of the staff members. Carolyn Kerr, through her work as Organist and Choirmaster, breathes much life, joy, and creativity to our worship. Monree Patterson, our Custodian, puts much care into cleaning and preparing the building for us and for those in our community who use the building for various purposes. Lucille Stanley takes excellent care of the children who visit the nursery during services and her work helps make the church welcoming to young families and children. Simply put, we are able to do the work of the church better because of our dedicated staff members.

In addition to my work in the parish, service to our community and our Diocese are very important to me. I have become involved in the community through the Greater Fairmont Council of Churches, and I hope to increase my participation and our parish commitment to responding to the hopes and needs of our community through the Council of Churches. The Council is an excellent avenue for service to our community and for growing in Christian unity. Having come to Christ Church from within our diocese, I was already involved in some of the ministries on our Diocesan level. I've remained the Program Leader for Senior Camp, the week-long high school summer camp at Peterkin and the Chair of the Commission on College and Young Adult Ministry. Ministry with our young people, not only here but in our Diocese, is a focus I always hope to have. In 2009, I was also elected as the Dean of our Deanery, which means that I convene our quarterly Deanery meetings and serve on the Diocesan Council.

I thank God for the year we've had, and I look forward to all that God has for us to do in the year ahead.

ECM Annual Report 2009

ECM mission statement – “The mission of the Christ Episcopal Church Men’s group is to provide opportunities for men (and others) to deepen their spirituality through commitment to Jesus Christ and the church, to enjoy Christian fellowship, to engage in outreach to the community and to provide funding for various projects of the congregation or groups of the congregation.”

Each year this mission statement serves as a preamble to my annual ECM report. As I read it this year I found myself reflecting back to its origin during Hugh Walker’s tenure. Hugh worked quietly to instill a deeper sense of outreach in all of us, beginning with the *Coffee House* for the teen-age crowd and extending to the Men’s group volunteering at the *Soup Opera*. Back then we faced severe budgetary problems much as we have today, but he always remained confident that if we served others and reached out beyond the confines of our parish God would provide for us. As we enter another new year my hope is that we continue to keep outreach as a focal point of our corporate ministry.

For the year 2009, the ECM served meals at the *Soup Opera* eleven of twelve months (we missed in October due to numerous scheduling conflicts) and spent \$1648.79 for supplies. Our average cost per meal served was approximately \$2.50. The income to do this was generated from the *Shrove Tuesday Pancake Supper* (\$930.61) and the *Strawberry Festival* (\$449.32). With the parish hall/kitchen renovations set to commence the first of February, we need to seek some ‘alternative’ sources to finance our outreach for the remainder of the year. The ECM did not meet formally during 2009, but hopefully we will remedy that later on this year.

The next scheduled volunteer day for serving at the Soup Opera is Saturday, February 20th, at 10:30 a.m. Please mark your calendar and join us in this ongoing ministry.
